On Sunday, December 10th, the Kentucky Bach Choir presents the final three cantatas of Bach's Christmas Oratorio. The concert is at First Presbyterian Church in Lexington at 7:30 pm.

As J.S. Bach said: "The aim and final end of all music should be none other than the glory of God and the refreshment of the soul." And who among us could not benefit from our soul being refreshed these days?

Please join us, and welcome our new Artistic Director, Richard Waters. The program begins with an organ piece by JSB performed by Schuyler Robinson, followed by a short motet by Felix Mendelssohn, who was, of course, hugely important in reviving interest in Bach's music in the 19th century. We conclude with the final three cantatas of Bach's "Christmas Oratorio". Soloists are Chloe Boelter, soprano (winner of our most recent Audrey Rooney Vocal Competition); Melissa Snow-Groves, mezzo-soprano; Dylon Crain, tenor/Evangelist; and Jeremy Kelly, bass.

ADULT PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER COMING TO CHATTANOOGA


The Chattanooga Chapter AGO will be hosting a Pipe Organ Encounter for Adults, June 9-14, 2024, in Chattanooga. A POE+ is open to organists ranging from beginners (proficient pianists who will learn the basics of organ playing) to advanced who are 19 years or older. This is an opportunity for organists to improve their practical skills at the organ, regardless of level. Participants will have daily lessons and practice on a variety of instruments, including a 94-rank Casavant, a 52-rank Aeolian-Skinner, a 14-rank 1889 A.B. Felgemaker, among others. There will be workshops on accompanying, hymn playing, and other organ skills. A visit to the Richards, Fowkes and Co. pipe organ builders shop, and daily evening concerts by the teaching faculty are among other highlights of the week. Hotel accommodations at a discounted rate are offered at DoubleTree by Hilton Chattanooga Downtown, \$124/night plus \$8/night parking.

Final from Symphony No. 1, and Berceuse Mariale from Sonata No. 1 by Rachel Laurin.


