



FREE RODGERS ORGAN

Jim Fitzpatrick has a 2 manual Rodgers digital organ (model 690) that he is giving away for free. It was given to him by a church in the area that no longer needed it and Jim has it stored safely in his garage. He has refinished the top of the bench and cleaned up the console, and has connected to speakers to ensure that everything works, and it sounds great. Due to it being in storage for several years, a qualified technician will need to service several items, including cleaning the contacts, replacing several keyboard felts, and replacing the rechargeable battery on the computer board. The instrument includes the bench, pedalboard, and console, and Jim will be happy to include the 4 speakers the instrument is connected to (and 4 speakers are required), although they are quite large. It has a comprehensive stop list and would make a nice instrument for home or a small church or chapel. This would be a great opportunity for church small groups as it leads up to Holy Week and Easter, and prizes will be awarded for the best Easter bonnets. 
