Grant says that it is in pristine condition, with the only issue being a pinched wire (connecting the pedal board to the console) that needs to be repaired, but that is a very small and perfunctory repair. It's a 2004 Lowrey Grand Royale, Model SU/600 and has a 2-octave pedalboard. The organ comes with its own leather bench with backrest, and the original owner's manual and accessories. It's FREE to a good home!

YEAR OF THE YOUNG ORGANIST

Do you know someone under the age of 30 who is interested in the organ? The American Guild of Organists is offering a free year of membership for organ students under the age of 30. Click [HERE](#) for more information. The Year of the Young Organist will provide online education programs that include master classes, webinars on organ maintenance, planning resources for the liturgical year, resume writing, and workshops that cover insurance, health and retirement, focused on both personal and professional development, to strengthen the young organist's career pathway.

The AGO is also creating an Organ Scholar Program that offers two young people the opportunity to experience a one-year internship at a significant music ministry program in the United States. This gap-year program will take place during 2022-23 and 2023-24 (one recipient per year for a total of two recipients in two different locations) and will provide \$30,000 in salary, as well as housing and health care for the organ scholar.


