Hello to all from the Fraziers! Don and I have welcomed a new (not brand new!) Rodgers practice organ into our home in Versailles some months ago, which allowed us to meet a new AGO friend and colleague in the process.

The organ's previous owner was Allan Kendall, a faithful Lexington Chapter member for many years who has attended Chapter events from time to time, including the Chapter's Christmas Pipes recitals. He has been in the process of downsizing/moving from his former home and had contacted Jane Johnson about advertising his home practice organ (the Scarborough 750, if you keep up with Rodgers models). Jane notified us, since she knew we were researching possible purchases.

Mr. Kendall has been taking meticulous care of the organ for many years – he still had the original Rodgers manual - and we are pleased and honored to continue its maintenance for keeping the organ active (VERY active).

We are keeping up with Allan, and we want to THANK him for his wish to keep the organ within Guild membership as well as his

support of our Chapter these past years. Thanks also to Jane, also for bringing us together!

Another referral of Jane's, Jones Piano Movers, established locally years ago, moved the organ to our Versailles home efficiently and smoothly – highly recommended!




