The deposited check ends up being returned for insufficient funds, but meanwhile the musician is out the money he/she paid to the other wedding vendors. So be cautious and don't be taken in by this scam.

# WHAT I DID ON MY SUMMER VACATION by Grant Holcomb

#### AGO Pipe Organ Encounter, Long Beach, CA

I was honored and privileged to be a teacher, presenter, and recitalist at the Long Beach, CA, Pipe Organ Encounter in June! I just finished a three year term on the AGO's National Committee for Young Organists (AGOYO). Each of us AGOYO officers spent a week this Summer at a POE.

In Long Beach, we had 11 very enthusiastic high school-aged organ students. I taught two of them – both going into their junior year of high school this Fall. I did my teaching on a 3-manual Schilcker from the 70s at California Heights UMC in Long Beach.

All of the students stayed in a

dorm at California State University-Long Beach. I was a dorm chaperone, so I stayed there too (no air conditioning, might I add!) We rented a 15-passenger van to shuttle the students around Southern California, taking them to see, hear, and play some incredible instruments. The main highlight for me was playing the mighty Hazel Wright organ at the former Crystal Cathedral in Orange County! The instrument just underwent a 10-year restoration by Ruffatti in Italy. 293 ranks, and mind-boggling to play, but a bucket list experience for me. After the Schullers and the Hour of Power Ministries went bankrupt, the Catholic Diocese of Orange County purchased the campus and restored everything - only changing what details were necessary to change to suit their ministry. A close-second highlight was playing a beautiful Fisk at Segerstrom Concert Hall (also in Orange County).

I also split a recital in Long Beach at First Congregational Church with another graduate student, Ethan Haman, who is finishing up his masters in organ at Yale, and that was great fun. A big 5-manual Moller (like Singletary!) - I felt right at home!

#### AGO National Convention – Seattle

I had a wonderful time at the AGO National Convention in Seattle this Summer! It was so nice seeing colleagues, and also especially nice to see faces familiar to Lexington including, but certainly not limited to: newly-elected Regional Councilor, Larry Sharp; Carolyn Craig; Katelyn Emerson; Bruce Neswick; and Jim McFarland, to name a few – they all bid their greetings to Lexington!

I enjoyed attending many great masterclasses, workshops, worship services, competitions, and concerts. It was fun hearing such a diverse array of organs over the course of the week! I hope to make it to the 2024 convention, and hope to see you there, too!
