

SUNDAY, JANUARY 12, 4:00p: James Kibbie Recital and Rededication of the Dirksen Portativ Organ at Christ Church Cathedral



At the center of Kibbie's recital will be the Dirksen portativ organ. The instrument has been delivered to Christ Church Cathedral following a complete and superb restoration by Buzard Pipe Organ Builders, Champaign, Illinois.

The organ was gifted to the Cathedral by the Dirksen family. Since the early 1950s, it has spent its life at Washington National Cathedral. The organ was built by Richard Watson Dirksen, grandfather of Rick and Mark Dirksen and father of Richard Wayne Dirksen, Organist and Choirmaster, and Precentor at Washington National Cathedral. The pipework was made by the Aeolian-Skinner Organ Company.


