Principal Pipings

An "improvisation journey"



This past summer we were fortunate to attend a presentation by Grammy-nominated organist, Jan Kraybill. Jan's talk was entitled *Off the Top of My Head: Easy Improvisation Tips for Service-Playing*. Jan believes we can "help congregational hymn-singing be more vibrant and worship more meaningful" by using printed music as a springboard for creativity.

Jan began by trying to comfort her audience, saying "you are already an improviser" if you play hymns, which are actually choral music, on the organ. To continue your "improvisation journey," you should spend 10% of your practice time on improvisation, because brilliant moments in hymn playing are rarely "off the top of one's head. . . it helps to have a plan." Here are some of her suggestions:

- Use hymn texts as inspiration--illustrate the drama in the poetry
- Be aware of each hymn/song's origin--what soundscape comes to mind?
- Spark interest with creative registrations, unusual rhythms, etc.
- Listen and imitate fellow musicians and recordings
- Study and borrow ideas from published hymn arrangements
- Investigate the growing repertoire of organ music in non-traditional styles

Our own Lexington AGO chapter provides a ton of possibilities for Jan's suggestion to "listen and imitate fellow musicians." Fortunately, we have a lot of options to listen to our chapter members electronically, if not in person. Take a bit of time to explore the livestreams or websites of your organ colleagues and you can learn a lot!

Jan Kraybill is the Organ Conservator at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts in Kansas City, Organist-in-Residence at Community of Christ denominational headquarters, and organist at Village on Antioch Presbyterian Church in Overland Park, Kansas. She has performed and led hymn festivals in North America, Europe, Australia, Russia, South Korea, and Tahiti.



LEXINGTON AGO CHAPTER MOURNS THE LOSS OF MEMBER CONNIE GOLDEN

Connie Dare Golden,79, died unexpectedly on Labor Day, September 1, 2025 on her way to the airport to enjoy a long-anticipated vacation with her husband. She was born in Richmond, Kentucky to Betty and Arbie Hensley and she studied piano and organ at Eastern Kentucky University (BM, BME, MM), the University of Oklahoma (MM) and the University of Kentucky (DMA).

Connie was awarded a George C. Marshall Fellowship to study the organ works of Dietrich Buxtehude in Copenhagen for a year and a half where she concertized extensively throughout Scandinavia and Northern Europe. Her principal teachers included Nancy Davis Lancaster and John Turnbull at Eastern Kentucky University,



Mildred Andrews Boggess at the University of Oklahoma, Jørgen Hansen at Holmens Kirke in Copenhagen, and Schuyler Robinson at the University of Kentucky. She had additional study with Anton Heiller, Marie-Claire Alain, and Harald Vogel.

She served as organist or organist/choirmaster for more than sixty years in Disciples of Christ, Episcopal, Lutheran, Presbyterian, and United Methodist churches in Kentucky, Ohio, Oklahoma, and Idaho. This included her time as organist/choirmaster at First Presbyterian in Richmond, organist and then organist/choirmaster at Second Presbyterian in Lexington, and Assistant Organist at Christ Church Cathedral in Lexington under Jeffrey Smith.

More than anything, she loved teaching and in addition to private lessons, she served on university music faculties in Idaho and Kentucky. Most recently, she taught piano and organ at Immanuel School of Music in Lakeside Park, Kentucky. She will be remembered for her passion, her dedication to her calling, and her insistence on giving her all to every endeavor she took up. She embodied her middle name.

AGOLex member David Cooper shared these memories: "Connie was around the School of Music at UK when I started the DMA in piano. What an incredible character! She was hilarious. When she got 'perturbed' about something, she became an unleashed hurricane. Connie could change registrations - never using pistons - at lightning speed. It was a marvel to watch. She knew how to really listen to her playing and let the harmonic structure guide her rhythmic motion . . . she knew how to 'play the room.' I was so glad to see that she was relaxed and happy at our last members recital [October 2024 at Good Shepherd]. Connie was a 'one of a kind' person and organist. I'm so happy I knew her."

She is survived by Dale Golden, her husband of forty-five years; four siblings; multiple nieces and nephews; and some lovely in-laws. A memorial service is scheduled for Bullittsville Christian Church, 3094 Petersburg Road, Burlington, KY on Saturday, October 11, 2025 at 11am, with visitation at the church from 9 to 11am, with a lunch to follow the service.




