
"Music for the Holidays: Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, New Year's, and Epiphany" at First Presbyterian

Saturday, March 28, 2026 - Bach Marathon, St. Raphael Episcopal Church, Lexington; a joint program with the Kentucky Bach Choir



The March 28 schedule will include a Bach chorale sing-a-long at **noon.** Singers at all levels of expertise are invited to participate; we hope to promote a connection to and appreciation for the chorales of J. S. Bach, as well as a connection between the musicians (both professional and non-professional) in this shared experience.

Suggested repertoire choices for performance range from beginning piano, instrumental, or vocal works, to professional repertoire. Solo performers as well as chamber ensembles are welcome.

Fifteen-minute performances are suggested; however, dependent on the expertise of performers and their chosen repertoire, 30-45 minute performances are also encouraged. Performers will be scheduled before and after the 12:00 noon chorale sing-a-long. An online sign-up for performance slots will be available starting in January 2026.






